

STUDENT EXECUTIVE EDITOR PROGRAMME

We are living a world where the development of digital technologies is challenging the traditional way of thinking. In the field of media law, there is increasingly a common need to address new regulatory issues, exploring trends of case law and practices adopted by courts and authorities. To face this scenario, MediaLaws.eu is a project which, since 2010, brings together academics and IT/media law professionals in a critical discussion on new developments in this field. The contributions hosted focus on recent developments from the European, comparative and domestic standpoint, and are included in the web portal (www.medialaws.eu), the law journal "*Rivista di diritto dei media*", and the working paper series "*Law and Media*" launched, respectively, in 2010, 2016, and 2017.

We intend to create a pool of committed **student executive editors (SEEs)**. SEEs will be involved both in the managing of the blog and the journals as well as in research activities.

Among the activities, SEEs will be required to: monitoring developments in case law, legislation and regulatory authorities regulations and preparing brief reports to be published in the web portal www.medialaws.eu and disseminated through its newsletter; carrying out a preliminary review on submissions received for consideration by prospective contributors and authors and providing the Editorial Board with a *prima-facie* feedback; editing scripts submitted for consideration, in order to align them with the house style.

The SEE Programme is for one academic year (October-July).

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Undergraduate or Postgraduate student in law, economics and political science;
- Fluency in English and/or Italian;
- Basic knowledge in the field of law and technology (e.g. courses and seminars attended; working experience).

WHY SHOULD YOU APPLY FOR THE SEE PROGRAMME?

- SEEs will acquire new competences such as editing, researching and managing content;
- SEEs will work closely with professors and researchers enjoying a new professional network and mentorship opportunities;
- SEEs will learn how to manage a professional blog developing new technical and organizational skills.
